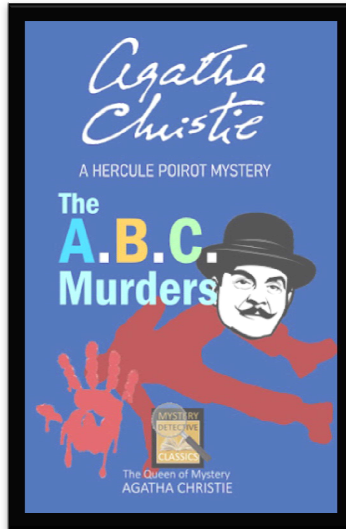


BOOK REVIEW
