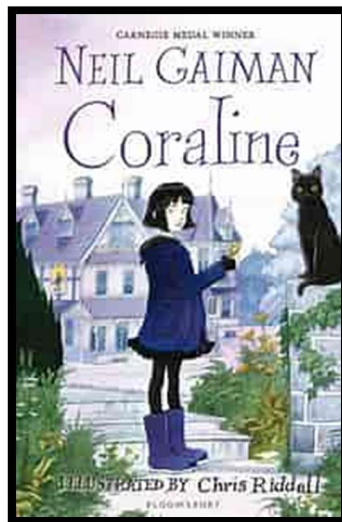

**Synopsis-** Neil Gaiman's 'Coraline' is a dark fantasy coming of age novella where the author talks about family and its various forms. The author draws a stark parallel between the two worlds presented in the story; the real world and the other world by mirroring all of the characters except Coraline and the black cat. The storyline follows the protagonist, Coraline, who comes across a secret door to the other world and must save herself and her family from evil forces.
