



"The Kite Runner," set in Kabul, tells the story of Amir, a young boy who spends his days kite fighting with his friend Hassan. Amir and his father eventually flee to the United States, where Amir marries Soraya Taheri. Years later, Amir receives a call from Rahim Khan, prompting him to travel to Peshawar and learn about Hassan's fate. This sets Amir on a journey to make amends and find redemption.
